

AVIVA EUROPEAN TRIALS AND UK CHAMPIONSHIPS PREVIEW

MK athletes set to shine on UK stage



NINE athletes from Milton Keynes are set for the biggest weekend of the season so far as they take part in the

European Trials and UK Championships in Birmingham. Craig Pickering (100/200m), Mervyn Luckwell (javelin), Hannah Douglas (400m hurdles), Chris Clarke (400m), Rachel Gibbens (pole vault), Greg Rutherford (long jump), Chloe Whalley (100m hurdles) and Joey Duck (200m) will all be hoping for a good show in the Trials for the chance to represent Great Britain in the European Championships in Barcelona next month. Marcin Fudalej (10,000m), who lives in Milton Keynes, will also be competing for Poland.

With the Olympic Games in London just two years away, the city athletes need to take advantage of every major championship event between now and 2012 to stake their

claim for a place in the GB side to perform in front of a home crowd on the biggest stage of them all. The Trials will be a hard-fought event with the top athletes from around the country competing for places on the plane to Spain in July.

The city athletes will be looking to improve on their performances from last year's UK Championships, where Pickering was disqualified from the semi-final of the 60m event and Chris Clarke qualified for the 200m final but did not finish the race. The competition was a success for Gibbens though as she finished 9th in the pole vault.

Meanwhile British number one long jumper Rutherford, will be looking to recreate his fantastic performance in the last European Championships in Gothenburg in 2006, where as a 19-year-old, he jumped 8.13m to land the silver medal.

JR shines at Kids Champs

EIGHT-year-old JR Ellis has got the potential to become a golfing superstar according to his coach

Abbey Hill Golf Club's teaching professional has been coaching the young star for the past year says he has seen all the hallmarks of a future Tour golfer.
The Loughton Middle School

pupil took up golf just two years ago and has been a member at Abbey Hill since he was six, fast

becoming a sensation. Young JR, whose favourite golfer is lan Poulter, recently joined the world's best young golfers in East Lothian, Scotland, for the prestigious US Kids European Championship, which saw more than 400 players from 30 nations compete in Europe's premier junior tournament.

Competing in the U8 category, JR finished 16th out of 30 competitors, leaving his coach pleased with his prodigy's accomplishments.

"It was great to see how JR compared to the other kids," said Armor, who caddied for him. "He hasn't played much tournament golf at all, so I was very pleased with his result. Unfortunately JR didn't putt as well as he can and that was the only difference between him and the winner.'

The top five in each age group – from U7 through to U18 – qualified to travel across the Atlantic to the United States to play in the US Kids World Championship at the famous Pinehurst

Resort.

Despite finishing outside the qualifying berths JR impressed organisers so much he received an invite to compete in the World Championships, but is so far undecided on whether take up the offer or concentrate on gaining some tournament experience on home soil.

JR's mother Jo Ellis, said: "We are not totally ruling out the trip to America but we would like to concentrate on as many UK tournaments as we can, so JR is better prepared and ready for

"JR's inspiration is to win and he loves a challenge. David has really helped to develop him and move him forward. They have a really good relationship and David knows exactly what makes JR tick and knows when JR needs to work on something and some how he is able to do it in a way that makes it

really challenging for him. "We are obviously extremely proud of JR, he has a natural talent and pure determination to be the best. Even at such a young

age he believes he will one day be up there and is convinced he will win the Masters and own a Green Jacket."

That may be a bold statement for one so young, but Armor has big hopes for his young charge. He added: "JR has great potential, and has aspirations to become a tour player. To have that hunger and desire at eight is
