JR Ellis has booked a spot on the Kids World Championships next year, after securing the UK title.

The 12-year-old golfer finished five over par at the Brampton Heath Golf Centre in Northamptonshire, beating the field by a considerable margin.

It means he's booked himself into the World Championships - considered to be the pinnacle event for junior golfers - at the famous Pinehurst course in North Carolina next year.

The result also sees JR's handicap dip into single figures, and he's about to have it

"Thave just had the best six weeks of my life and my whole game has come together," said JR, from Medbourne.

"I have played over 30 tournaments up and down the country, I have won most of them or been in contention.

"I only had three official-

ly planned days off from golf throughout the holidays but, I still managed to find a course and play every day.

"But it's what I do and I dont know anything else.

"It helps me to relax and unwind."



Premier League football could be coming to Milton Keynes far sooner than expected if Tottenham Hotspur have their

With renovation plans afoot to increase the capacity of White Hart Lane, the north London club revealed that they'd be seeking a temporary home in three year's time in 2017-18.

While taking up residence at Wembley or the Olympic Stadium have been touted, it is understood that Spurs' preferred option is to move 49 miles north to play their football at stadium:mk.

On Wednesday, Tottenham issued a statement declaring they'd be leaving White Hart Lane for a year, and said they'd be carrying out 'due diligence' to find another place to play.
The statement said: "The

club has revised its construction programme in order to take the shortest possible time to construct," said the statement.

"This now therefore involves the club moving away from the Lane during construction for a period of one

"We are currently undertaking due diligence on alternative stadium options."

Last month, stadium:mk was full to capacity for the visit of Manchester United - the first time both tiers had been fully open to the public.

While Dons' average attendances are hovering around the 8,000 mark, Spurs would undoubtedly bring a bigger fanbase to fill the stadium-something Dons chairman Pete Winkelman has said would fulfil its purpose.

Speaking after the United game, Winkelman said: "One of the best bits was walking out and seeing both tiers full. It looked fantastic.

"It's what the stadium was built for.
